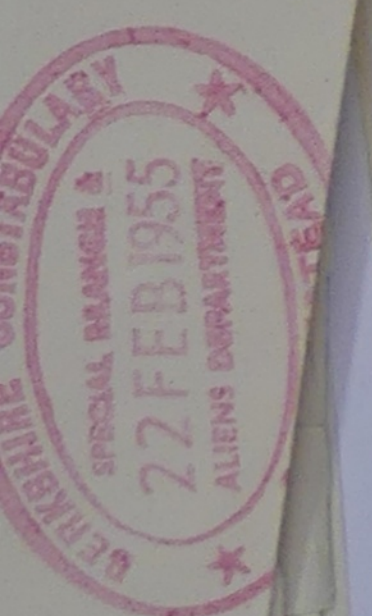

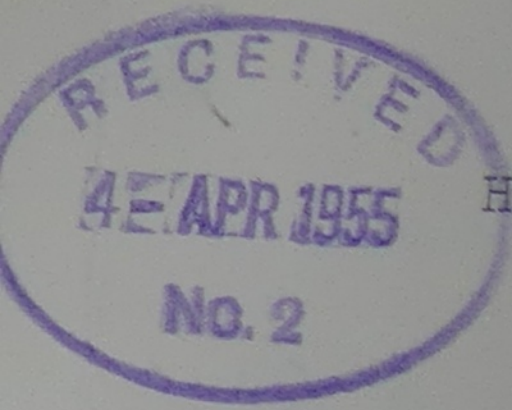

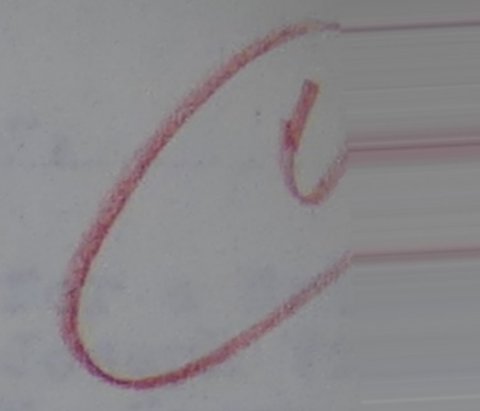

With reference to the application for a British certificate of naturalisation by Count Joseph Vincent Adalbertus Maria William Romanus CZERNIN, Czech, registered with Metropolitan Police as Josef CZERNIN, residing at 23, Seymour Place, W.1. :-

The personal particulars as given by the applicant in his statements on the application form have been enquired into so far as possible, and the form appears to have been completed correctly with the exception that:

1. he has Anglicised his names, which, according to his birth certificate, should read: Josef Vincenc Vojtech Maria Vilem Roman Czernin. He is commonly known by the forename of 'Joseph'.
2. he has no documentary proof that he has lost his Czechoslovakian nationality, and he says that he has not been informed at any time by the Czech Authorities that he has lost his nationality.
3. his father's name should read: Frantisek Josef Czernin.
his mother's name should read: Vilemina Maria Czernin, nee Clanner.

He has failed to initial the deleted clause (7).

Since submitting the application applicant has changed his place of work and has been in West Germany on holiday and visiting friends from 2.5.55 - 15.5.55.

Applicant produced a copy of his birth certificate. His Czech passport No. 3764/3147/47 issued Prague 14.3.1947 (contained in H.O. file C.27509/2) also confirms his date and place of birth. He also produced papers relevant to his antecedents and proof of his financial position.

CZERNIN was born at Prague, Czechoslovakia on 9.8.1924, his parents being Count Frantisek Josef

naturalisation were that he has been here for eight years as a

Czernin and Countess Vilemina Maria Czernin, nee Clanner.

He was educated in Prague until 1943 then with others of his age group he was taken by the Germans to work in a Labour Corps in Munich, Berlin, Markierch, etc. As the Allied Troops advanced in 1944-45 his Corps was withdrawn and by February 1945 he was working under the Germans in a Prague factory. After hostilities ended he worked with the International Red Cross in Prague.

In September 1945 applicant became a full-time student at Charles University, Prague, with a view to qualifying in law. He took his first examination at the beginning of 1947, and on 1.5.47 he came to this country for the purpose of improving his knowledge of the English language. He was landed at Folkestone on a 'no employment' condition but this condition was varied from time to time by Home Office until 14.1.1953 when it was cancelled.

Applicant had come here as a student in May 1947 and he was staying with, and being maintained by, his sister and her British husband. In accordance with the regulations he obtained an extension of his stay until 30.9.1947, and was also given permission to work as a machine tool fitter with the Victoria Machine Tool Co. Ltd., Victoria Works, Willesden, N.W.10.

His Czech passport was valid only until 30.9.1947. He says that when he called at the Czech Embassy here to have the validity of his passport extended he unexpectedly found a communist official there who had arrived to supervise the Embassy, and as he was liable for military service this official refused to extend his passport. Applicant says he immediately wrote to his parents in Prague and they used their influence to obtain permission from the Czech Ministry of Education for him to remain here as a student. His passport was extended to 31.10.47 and he was required to provide evidence that he was in fact continuing his studies here. Accordingly on 21.10.47 he started a course at the Balham & Tooting Day School of Commerce, Tooting Broadway, S.W.17, and his passport was subsequently extended to 1.9.48 on authority given in Prague and without reference to the Communist Party official in the Czech Embassy here.

He was also given an extension of his military service.

Applicant frankly admitted that he was returning to Czechoslovakia in the present situation. On the inter-visitations given permission by Home Office his parents were given a similar extension.

On 23.10.1948, with the permission, applicant stayed in London with Couper, Friend & Co. He was continuously engaged in the firm from 30.4.55 and started work as an administrative assistant in the Iberian Division) of the Court, Crosby Square, E.C.4. He has a salary of £1,000, and pays tax at the rate of 10%.

At the time of enquiry applicant owned industrial shares, which were held in the name of his father, also had approximately £1,000 in the name of his father, Ltd., Marble Arch branch.

Applicant's parents live in Czechoslovakia but they have no assets in order to get a passport in 1948 and they are now free to travel.

They live together in a flat in a shop at 23, Seymour Place, W.1. Their year's lease from 1950. The rent is £100 per quarter, and this sum includes gas and water rates totalling £100 per year.

Applicant and his parents have no other assets, conditions, apparently himself to be entirely satisfied as they are possible, he claims.

Applicant has an excellent command of the English language.

He said that his parents' naturalisation were the same as his own.

He was also given an extension to his exemption from military service.

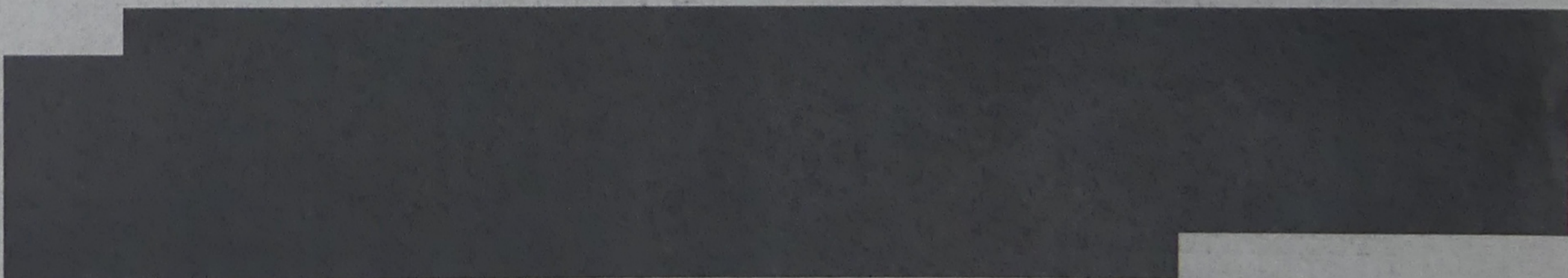
Applicant frankly admits that he was planning to avoid returning to Czechoslovakia because of the worsening political situation. On the intervention of friends he was subsequently given permission by Home Office to remain and work here, and his parents were given visas to come to this country.

On 23.10.1948, with Ministry of Labour & National Service permission, applicant started work as a senior shipping clerk with Couper, Friend & Co. Ltd., 33/35, Eastcheap, E.C.3 and he was continuously engaged in that way until he left on 30.4.55 and started work on 16.5.55 in his present position as an administrative assistant in the European Department (Iberian Division) of the Shell Petroleum Co. Ltd., St. Helen's Court, Crosby Square, E.C.4. He receives a yearly salary of £1,000, and pays tax at source.

At the time of enquiry applicant had £500 invested in industrial shares, which, so far, have shown no return. He also had approximately £200 in an account with Barclays Bank Ltd., Marble Arch branch.

Applicant's parents were of independent means in Czechoslovakia but they had to sacrifice their home and assets in order to get permission to leave Czechoslovakia in 1948 and they are now fully maintained by applicant.

They live together in the upper part of premises over a shop at 23, Seymour Place, W. which were taken on a seven year's lease from 1950. The premises cost them £70.17.9 a quarter, and this sum includes the rent of £56.5.0 and general and water rates totalling £14.12.9.



Applicant and his parents live under clean respectable conditions, apparently within their means. Applicant declares himself to be entirely free from debt, and enquiries, so far as they are possible, have disclosed nothing to dispute that claim.

Applicant has an adequate knowledge of the English language.

He said that his reasons for applying for British naturalisation were that he has been here for eight years as a

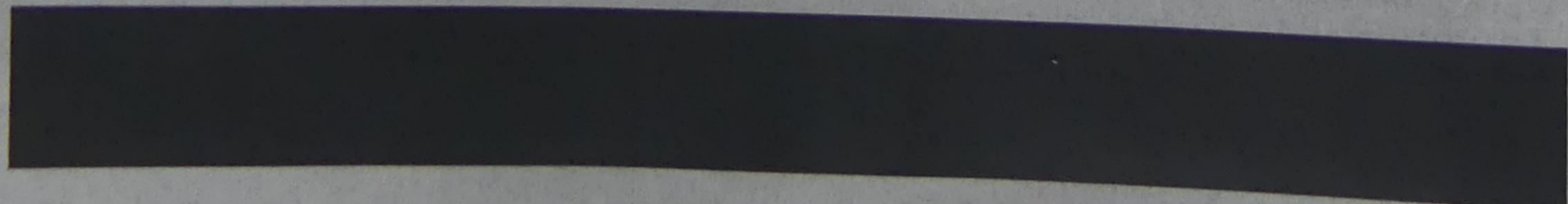

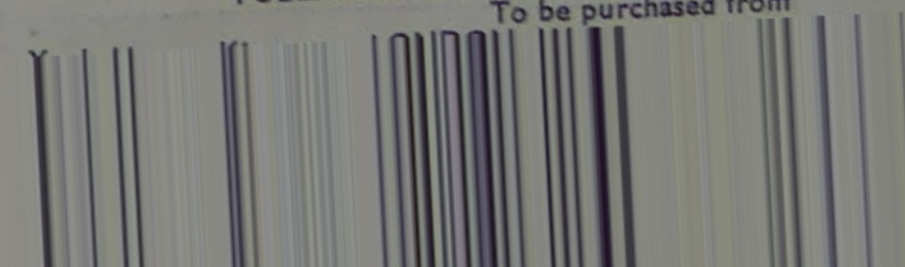
